National Cumann na mBunscol Annual Awards 2025

PAT TRAINOR HALL OF FAME AWARD

This award honours a teacher who has given years of service to Gaelic games promotion. The winner will receive two All Ireland tickets. Nominations should be made by county or provincial units and submitted to Chairman, Micheál MacThiarnain by 31 October 2025.

CATEGORY 1: PUBLIC RELATIONS AWARD

First prize: €500, second prize: €400, third prize: €300. Coistí are asked to submit their PR work for 2024/25 in a bound book. Include materials like tweets, website screenshots, articles, fixtures booklets, and publications

CATEGORY 2: SOCIAL MEDIA AWARD

First prize: €500, second prize: €400, third prize: €300. Coistí are invited to submit 2024/25 social media in a bound book, PowerPoint, or PDF. Include dated posts (e.g. Twitter, Facebook, website).

NB. Entries in Category 1 and 2 qualify for a PR grant. A project submitted in category 3 cannot be submitted for category 4 or 5.

CATEGORY 3: PROMOTION OF GAELIC GAMES AND CULTURE

First prize: €600, second prize: €500, third prize: €400. Award recognising schools efforts in promoting Gaelic games and culture since September 2024. Submissions should be a PowerPoint or short movie.

CATEGORY 4 AND 5 - SCHOOL OF THE YEAR

First prize: €1000, second prize: €500, third prize: €500. This category is for schools that have actively participated in Gaelic games since September 2024. There should also be evidence of the input of pupils. Category 4: Schools with 200 pupils or fewer. Category 5: Schools with 201 pupils or more.
