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Standing Orders

- 1. The Cathaoirleach shall preside over all meetings and shall see that the rules of the organisation be enforced sensibly and fairly on all occasions.
- 2. Motions to the Annual General Meeting, which shall be in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than the last Friday in January.
- **3.** All nominations for positions on the National Committee which shall be in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than three weeks before the AGM.
- **4.** The National Committee shall consider all motions and nominations and decide if they are in order and acceptable for consideration at the AGM.
- 5. Copies of the agenda for the AGM together with list of motions and nominations for elections to National Committee shall be circulated to all affiliated areas and Provincial Councils at least 7 days before the AGM.
- 6. Amendments and agenda will be with the National Secretary in writing in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council at least one hour before the AGM.
- 7. Contrary motions shall not be accepted.
- 8. All motions must be clear and unambiguous and must not conflict with the aims and objectives of Cumann na mBunscol
- **9.** (a) To be deemed in order a motion must be implementable and must be specific to Cumann na mBunscol.

(b) However motions may call on Cumann na mBunscol to negotiate with relevant bodies on a specific matter that is of interest to Cumann na mBunscol.

- **10.** The mover of a proposal shall speak for not more than three minutes.
- 11. The seconder of a proposal shall speak for no more than three minutes.

- 12. No motion shall be discussed for more than 20 minutes. The motion must be disposed of when the 20 minutes have elapsed.
- 13. The mover shall have the right of reply in all cases. 2 minutes maximum.
- **14.** Voting shall be by a show of hands on all motions. A simple majority shall ensure the adoption of any item. Where rule changes are proposed, a two thirds majority shall be necessary in every instance to ensure their adoption.
- **15.** The usual method for the disposal of amendments and agenda shall be followed.
- **16.** In the event of the proposition "That the question be put", and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall on a show of hands either continue the debate or 'Put the question'.
- **17.** In the event of the proposition "That the AGM, move to next business " and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall put the proposition to a vote immediately. If defeated the debate shall be resumed.
- **18.** If a position on the National Committee be contested. voting shall be by secret ballot. A successful candidate must have 50% + 1 of the valid votes cast by delegates present and voting at the AGM. In the event of a tie, the winning candidate will be drawn by lot.
- **19.** The chairman may at his discretion ask if there is no obvious objection to a motion that the motion be put in order, to save time.
- 20. The chairman may at his discretion and in consultation with order officers change the order of business in the interest of efficiency.
- **21.** The order of business may also be changed at the request of a majority of delegates present and voting.
- 22. Only properly constituted delegates may speak at the AGM. Other speakers may only address the AGM when prior arrangements are made through the National Committee.

1. Welcoming of Delegates:

The Chairman Paul Duggan welcomed all to the meeting in particular Liam O Neill Uachtarán and Séamus Walsh County Chairman An Dún. Séamus Walsh also addressed delegates and welcomed all to the County. In his address he mentioned the importance of having a strong and committed Cumann na mBunscol and he thanked all present for the marvellous work being done.

2. Adoption of Standing Orders:

Standing Orders were adopted on the proposal of Patrick Morrissey (London). Seconded by Killian O'Reilly (Waterford).

3. Address of Paul Duggan Cathaoirleach Cumann na mBunscol

Is mór an phríbléid dom bheith I bhur láithair inniú agus ar son An Choiste Náisiunta, ba mhaith liom ár mbuíochas a thabhairt daoibh as gach rud a rinne sibh dúinn i rith na mbliana.

The purpose of today is to thank you for the work that is ongoing in our schools, to review the year past, to engage with and listen to you and to give you an insight into how strategically significant we see the work of games promotion and preservation in our Primary Schools. We want you to work with us in building a stronger Cumann na mBunscol. To pay lip service or indeed to patronise is not good enough. Let me make it clear my aim is to create a robust. vibrant and successful Cumann na mBunscol, sure of our rationale, steadfast in our commitment and strong in our identity. As officers of the various County





Units you owe this to the children in our schools, their families and to our clubs and counties. Such will be our legacy. Your cooperation is vital. Our leadership is non-negotiable. You should demand vision, integrity and resolve from An Choiste Náisiúnta.

In our recent review, July 2012, of our activity and structures we tried to address the issue of our relevance today. We identified many strengths and indeed areas for improvement in the Primary School Sector. We are challenged to address these as best we can, together towards improvement is a phrase we are familiar with here in the six counties. I would like to challenge you to reflect on how we should proceed. We will follow on from our meeting in early December when we looked at our Constitution. We will convene a small group, which is representative and present a document for discussion in September.

We are faced with propensity versus capacity. Many of our Units will not be able to deliver without input from Coaching and Games and a commitment from An Choiste Náisiunta, from County Boards and from our schools. The challenge is for all partners to accept their respective roles and to play their part in a changing society where altruistic or traditional values are diminishing. This will work best when we are strong, determined and challenging, perhaps even challenged. There is no need to surrender our unique identity. Are we tired? Are we content to acquiesce in the comfort zone, of leave well alone, sure I got a few tickets in September, or are we prepared to work together to deliver what our Constitution asks, - "to promote and foster our National Games". Are we not privileged to be able to introduce every child in our schools to the games and activities which define us, the games which set us apart, forge our identity and make us what we are? To pull at the heartstrings of a notional romantic Ireland where every child has a hurley in his or her hand is merely jingoistic idealism. But we are challenged to be the best that we can be, to deliver for our children, our schools and our counties. How are we going to do that? Are we prepared to do it in an Ireland of weary, disgruntled, disillusioned professionals? Yes we are because of our grá for our games, our nation, our

language, our Parish School and Club and ultimately our Counties. It is for each individual here to decide, to auestion to commit.

Let us forge a strong identity, sure of what we are about. A strong Cumann na mBunscol has nothing to fear. Our greatest threat is lethargy.

4. Minutes:

Delegates were invited to browse through the minutes of A.G.M. 2012. The minutes were then adopted on the proposal of Ciarán Crowe (Luimneach), seconded Kevin Toner (Doire).

5. Arising from Minutes:

The Chairman thanked the Sponsors of Cumann na mBunscol in particular Allianz, Cornmarket and Mycro.

6. Correspondence:

Nothing to hand. Minutes of the of September 23rd 2012 meeting were proposed by Jim Mc Cann (Aontroim) seconded by Bríd Ní Chléirigh (Port Láirge).

7. Secretary's Report:

The Secretary Noeleen Rooney gave a very comprehensive report which included Administration, Allianz, The Cornmarket National Awards in Conjunction with Mycro, Handball, GAA / INTO Mini-Sevens. Noeleen thanked the National Committee but most of all she thanked the Teachers for their tremendous work in promoting Gaelic Games. The report was proposed by Edward O'Riordan (Laighin) seconded Niall McQuaid (Tír Eoghan).

8. Treasurer's Report:

Liam Magee (Fear Manach) gave a detailed report to the meeting, he thanked Joan Kelly (Finance Dept. Croke Park) for all her help with the accounts.

Total Expenditure: €183,977

Surplus for period transferred to Reserves: €26,639

Net Current Assets: €186,013

(Brought Forward, €159,374 --- add Surplus €26,639)

Killian O'Reilly (Port Láirge) complimented the Treasures on his report. Máiréad Ni Cheallacháin (Corcaigh) asked that the amount of the Allianz Grant given to each county be published and sent out to each county. (Agreed)

Gerry O'Meara (Báile Átha Cliath) asked if Cumann na mBunscol would have a stand at the I.N.T.O. Congress. (There will be one).

Accounts proposed Jim O'Riordan (Cill Mhantáin) seconded Fiona Delaney (Laois)

9. Development Report:

In his report Development Officer referred to the following:

- a) Relevance of Cumann na mBunscol in a Club Driven Environment
- b) Coach Education
- c) GAA / INTO Mini Sevens, the Respect Initiative and **Exhibition Games**
- d) Various Meeting Held
- e) The National Awards

Killian O'Reilly (Port Láirge) asked who was Cumann na mBunscols representative on the National Coaching and Games Committee and what was the position regarding the Go Games. Pat Culhane responded as our representative on Coaching and Games and spoke regarding Rule 6.26 and the Go Games format.

John Byrne (An Mhí) congratulated Jim Fennelly Development Officer on his report and asked where the report would go from here. (It would be sent to Paraic O'Dufaigh in Croke Park) Jim Dempsey (Loch Gorman) stated that the report should go back to each County Board.

Development report proposed by Jim Dempsey (Loch Gorman) seconded John Byrne (An Mhí)

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10. P.R.O's. Report:

The P.R.O. Brendan Rice reported on the following:

- a) Allianz Sponsorship, he welcomed Damien O Neill from Allianz to the meeting
- b) I.N.T.O. Congress
- c) In Touch
- d) Website
- e) Cornmarket National Awards
- f) Match Programmes

Much discussion took place, Killian O'Reilly (Port Láirge) asked about the format of the Awards in 2013. Bernie Rvan (Sligeach) informed delegates that the format and categories for 2013 will be announced later in the year. Some Categories will remain, however Cornmarket are very keen to continue with the Awards. Maybe each County should have a presentation and have a representative of Cornmarket there. Aodán Wrenn (Tiobrad Árann) congratulated the Awards Committee on having the winning projects on display, but he added that he had concern regarding the judging of them.

The Website is very close to completion and it will be formally launched shortly. Paul Duggan (Ard Mhaca) thanked the Secretary Noeleen Rooney (Longfort) for all her work on the site John Byrne (An Mhí) asked that an Annual Report be published regarding Allianz coverage. Joe Lyons (Luimneach) and Gerry Hussey (An Gallimh) stated that there were some problems with local editors publishing the names of sponsors.

Aodán Wrenn (Tiobrad Árann) said he was delighted to see the piece from each participating county in the match programme for All-Ireland Semi-Finals and Finals and he hoped this would continue.

Report proposed by Tadhg Kenny (Báile Atha Cliath) seconded Patricia Hunt (Sligeach).

11. GAA/I.N.T.O. Mini-Sevens Report:

Mini-Sevens Review Presented by Pat McGivern: (Each section of the report was accepted or rejected on a show of hands)



- a) No change to the allocation of places. Each County to be allocated 6 places with Cork receiving 12 and Dublin 24, Britain to receive 4. The 20 remaining places will be distributed to the four provinces with each province receiving 5 places in the same code and the code to be rotated each year. These extra places are under the direction and management of the provincial committees. Accepted.
- b) No child can play in Croke Park in any code more than once in their Primary School Life. Accepted.
- c) Only 1 boy and 1 girl can represent their individual school in any one year to ensure that as many different schools as possible are represented in Croke Park. Accepted.
- d) We recommend that pupils who play in Croke Park in Mini-Games cannot represent their school/ Province in Primary Game/Provincial games in that school year. Accepted.
- e) We recommend that the Mini-Games be played at half-time of Senior Hurling and Football Finals. Accepted.
- f) **1.** All counties go to a Skills Based selection process by 2016 regarding Mini-Games **2.** That counties have autonomy of their own selection process. Accepted.

13. Uachtarán CLG Liam Ó Néill:

Liam Ó Néill addressing the delegates stated:

- a) Delighted to be with Cumann na mBunscol.
- **b)** Appreciate the work of Cumann na mBunscol and Teachers.
- c) Enjoyable 9 months as Uachtaráin.
- d) Since 1977 involved with Primary School activities.
- e) Right of each Primary School to have self autonomy.
- f) Committed to Mick Martin Coaching and Games.
- g) Primary Coaching 21 years old.
- h) I.N.T.O. Gender Equality, more coaching of girls
- i) Our duty to put the child first duty of care (Pat Culhane), deal with child differently.
- j) Go Games, challenge to give everyone a game, good news 30% increase in participation, positive response from parents.



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- k) Safety is paramount to all Teachers.
- I) Integrity the family of Gaelic Games we are five separate parts - Rounders, Handball, Camogie, Ladies Football and Hurling and Football. Are we one organisation? Can we do what happens at Primarv Level?
- m) No Primary School Committee should have to pay money for hire of pitches.
- n) Uachtaráin troubled that Teachers would not want to be associated with the GAA. Croke Park does not want to control but wants to work in cooperation to consult each other.
- o) 3 year plan to be inclusive to have all playing Go Games in a friendly atmosphere.
- p) Feile Peile/Iomáint savage competition looking at it (National Feile Committee) -from next year to take the competitiveness out of it.
- q) Minor reduced to under 17 keep it skilful ---nurture the teenager.

The Uachtarán finished his address by stating that as a Primary Teacher he was proud to be President of the GAA and to be able to influence and change. It is with the cooperation of Primary Teachers that we can make Gaelic Games the choice of every Primary School Child and in doing so we can make the GAA a power and a positive influence in Irish society.

Motion 3:

A sub-committee, established by An Choiste Náisiúnta of Cumann na mBunscol, audit all Cumann an mBunscol structures and levels of all activities in each County and Province and report to the September meeting in 2013. (Cumann na mBunscol na Mumhan) Proposed Killian O'Reilly (Port Láirge) seconded Aodan Wrenn (Tiobraid Árann), Passed,

Motion 4:

Cumann na mBunscol Port Láirge demand that an Choiste Náisiúnta make representation to Croke Park and the Department of Education and Science to have Cumann na mBunscol Games and Activities included as part of any Agreement on Additional Time in Schools, acknowledging the voluntary effort of so many teachers, the importance of Cumann na mBunscol Games and Activities in enriching the lives of pupils and therefore enshrining the importance of our National Games in the Curriculum. (Cumann na mBunscol Port Láirge, Cumann na mBunscol na Mumhan) Proposed Eamonn Mac Gearailt (Port Láirge) seconded Tim O' Byrne (Port Láirge). Passed.

Motion 5:

Cumann na mBunscol Náisiunta requests that the rule regarding the wearing of mouth guards be postponed for Primary Schools games and training until clarification is sought and obtained regarding the practical effects in Primary Schools. (Cumann na

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mBunscol Tiobraid Árann, Cumann na mBunscol na Mumhan) Proposed Aodán Wrenn (Tiobraid Árann) seconded Mairead NíCheallachán (Corcaigh), Passed.

15. Address by invited Guest: Damien O'Neill (Allianz):

Damien O'Neill addressed the delegates under the following headings:

- a) Brief introduction to Allianz
- b) Brief introduction to the speaker
- c) Allianz supporting Communities
- d) Allianz, the GAA and Cumann na mBunscol
- e) Allianz Cumann na mBunscol score card
- f) Looking at the future

Allianz is proud to have supported the GAA for 21 years and Cumann na mBunscol for 20 years (1993-2013). Damien acknowledged that no other sporting organisation has done more for local communities than the GAA. The GAA, Cumann na mBunscol is recognised as making the greatest contribution to Irelands Social Capital since its foundation.

Allianz Cumann na mBunscol: In Cumann na mBunscol "ownership remains a major problem" getting the brand out there, reference to Allianz in the posting of Cumann na mBunscol activities is







paramount to the success of this initiative and is the key performance indicator. However the latest report received in from Kantar is trending in the opposite direction to that we had hoped. The modest 48% ownership achieved at the end of 2012 school year has dropped by 7 points to 41% with absolutely no performance improvement in certain counties. This position is even worse when one completes a simple Google search on the terms Allianz Cumann na mBunscol and Cumann na mBunscol, which returns a derisory 17% ownership of reference to Allianz.

Allianz sponsorship to Cumann na mBunscol is €100.000.00. Damien was hopeful to have a three year deal but the latest figures are disappointing. He stated that he had hoped that we had turned the corner on this, and that all that was said and committed to last vear, would have delivered a positive uplift in the first half of the year - but alas - not so.

We need to get the brand **Allianz Cumann na mBunscol** out there, and this time next year, if results are more positive, we maybe able to announce a three vear sponsorship deal.

This concluded the business of the meeting.

Cornmarket National Awards in Conjunction with Mycro:

The Cornmarket Awards Banquet took place in The Hogan Mezzanine Suite, Croke Park Stadium on Saturday, November 16th, 2013. Ivan Ahern, Cornmarket, GAA President, Liam O'Neill and INTO President, Brendan O'Sullivan, were in attendance. Development Report

As delegates to AGM made their way from the Kingdom of Mourne on the morning of February 10th last year no doubt they were pondering the revelation by Uachtarán Liam o Neill that he had appointed a working group to examine the position of the GAA in primary Schools with particular reference to the relationship with Cumann na mBunscol.

Review committees operate all the time in the GAA and there is normally nothing sinister in their terms of reference. However to hear about the working group in an informal way on Feb 9th when it was first announced on 6th of January at Ard Comhairle left this

delegate somewhat concerned at the veil of secrecy surrounding it.

But you must play the hand you are dealt and proceedings got underway with an initial meeting of all national committee members and the review committee. It was courteous and sought to summarise where Cumann na mBunscol was in terms of its strategic plan and set down a starting point for the review. After that initial ice breaker it was left to our Chairman to represent the national committee at the working group's meetings.

Time rolled on and a run of events placed your

Development officer in the position of representative of Cumann na mBunscol at the review committee meetings. My first meeting was on November 23rd with the review chairman and secretary. It was at this meeting that I learned of the diarised meetings of April 4th, May 24th, July 17th and October 26th. To say one was in the dark would be an understatement.

My thoughts then.....

"The game was well on and as we were heading into injury time I was left wondering what I could do to even make an impression on the final outcome. I did have a careful eye on the ball following what can only be described as an off the ball incident, worthy of the black card, at a national meeting around about Féile na Samhain. I dusted myself off for the common good and played on to the best of my ability for the good of the team"

A full meeting of the review committee was held on December 12th which was to be its final one. It became clear to me that many decisions had already been made and in many respects the report was no longer embryonic but if anything, running overdue. As this report goes to print the report of the review committee has not been published and I do not want to pre-empt its contents as this would be unfair. However as this is my report to you, the delegates at the 2014 AGM of Cumann an mBunscol there are some points I wish to make about what may appear in the final report.

Governance

The review committee was informed by Cumann na mBunscol at meeting of review committee 7.12.2013 that verifiable evidence at Ard Comhairle level would be sought where it was proposed, seconded and agreed by members of central council to enter negotiations with Cumann na mBunscol to establish structures that would facilitate the promotion and control of all gaelic games within one organisation and consequently bring Cumann na mBunscol under general rule. The letter would be tabled for





consideration at the Jan 18th 2014 Central Council meeting. A lot will hinge on what response will come from this request and we can only await its delivery. While I feel governance is the big issue there will also be recommendations around:

- **Finance:** The control of the current account and the handling of sponsorship funds.
- 5 year rule: How it would serve to invigorate the organisation.
- Increased involvement of ladies in Cumann na mBunscol
- Transparency in the allocation of All-Ireland tickets.
- Sponsorship/Marketing and Website
- Coaching and Games: Likely to favour a non competitive environment.
- **Control** that national body has over its provincial bodies and county coistí
- Teacher time in schools.
- Retired teachers holding office in Cumann na mBunscol.

The full treatment of these items will be greeted with guarded optimism by those who expressed concern at the modus operandi in the first place. There are questions around the consultation process. Why for example was it stated that all county chairmen and secretaries of Cumann na mBunscol would be interviewed in the process but then a decision not to do so was taken towards the end of the review process? The question in relation to affiliation to the GAA was misleading as many who answered yes to this question might not have been aware of the implications for Cumann na mBunscol coming under general rule of the GAA. The question of funding must also be raised in all of this process. If the review does not compare fairly, the funding given to all the educational bodies then the report will be incomplete by its nature and an opportunity will also be missed. Subsidising hurleys,



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helmets and goalposts all cost money and if a county is doing this effectively it needs substantial funds. Clubs/ County Boards are encouraged to assist the primary schools in their area but we know that many of our Coistí operate on their own in this regard. In fact in some cases very little has changed since 1981 report.

Games and Development in 2013

Annual congress of the GAA passed a motion in 2013 that gave central council the decision making power on how games up to U13 in clubs and schools would be organised. (Yes I hear you Cumann an mBunscol is not under general rule but, this needs clarification immediately) This rule is referred to as 6:26 Go Games. While Cumann na mBunscol organises its games independently it has in its constitution that it will endeavour to align itself with the GAA. This really implies that Cumann na mBunscol will seek to follow best practice but within the limitations that the school setting presents.

There is a motion before you today that seeks to address the whole small sided games issue. While the majority of counties organise small sided leagues there are still some counties who can quite legitimately organise 15 a side leagues mainly because they combine schools in a parish or they may be in centres of highly populated areas. In fact some of these counties can demonstrate the inclusion of multiple 15 a side teams by schools in appropriate grades. This is a huge undertaking in any school and must require a lot of teacher input. This motion is asking that counties apply to the national committee for sanction of 15 a side leagues with the criteria clearly stated. It would be my opinion that all counties who wish to organise 15 a side leagues would qualify under one of the three criteria.

I refer you back to the motion of 2010 on games and development which was passed and written into rule that games would be "child centred, small sided, developmentally appropriate and capable of giving all players meaningful game time"

Recommendations

The following recommendations are made to focus even more on some specifics. There was a lot of debate in 2013 about the 3rd and 4th class child involved in games at the senior end of the school leagues. It is fair to say that the inclusion of the 3rd class child (and its equivalent in northern Ireland) in an U13 school's game is bordering on dangerous. There should be no situation where this is encouraged to happen. County Coistí should emphasise small sided leagues to avoid this and I am glad to see that this is hugely the case. The 4th class child is a different scenario. It is possible that a fourth class child could be 10 years and 10 months in the year of a league if he/she started school in September having just turned five on Sept 1st. This child could be physically stronger than the child in a class above him/her and therefore it is easy to see how a school would include him/her in the school leagues. To this end the recommendation stands that the fourth class child or P5 in Northern Ireland can be included but not at the expense of the 5th or 6th class child P6 or P7.

Large numbers in a school for those who find themselves managing this situation should consider entering multiple teams in appropriate grades. This can go a long way to giving meaningful game time. County Coistí should facilitate this by organising multiple divisions. I know geography can play a part in this in many large counties and also teacher power is vital to the working of such a plan. Where it is working it pays rich dividends for the schools who opt for it.

I fail to see why children are organised in large panels of 25-30 and then given the impression that they will get meaningful game time. The child who is part of this arrangement will know full well that if he or she gets ten minutes at the end of a game that due to its lopsidedness, is conceded, knows also that it is not a meaningful ten minutes. It is recommended that whatever the maximum number constitutes a team in your leagues that no more than 5 additional players is added as panel members. Meaningful game time can

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be given to all players in this situation but not if the number escalates beyond this measure.

It is the hope that all our county Coistí could give serious consideration to these recommendations when they sit down at their fixtures meetings over the next few weeks.

In the meantime please enjoy the AGM and I urge you to speak your mind at every opportunity. Don't wait for somebody else to do it for you. Our meeting in September will largely deliver to you a flavour of what becomes crystallized at the AGM. The decisions we make become policy so have your say and use your vote as you see best.







Finally I leave you with a thought from J.R.R Tolkien and it is as quoted that we go on "feeling the wall" but onwards no less.

"Go back?" he thought. "No good at all! Go sideways? Impossible! Go forward? Only thing to do! On we go!" So up he got, and trotted along with his little sword held in front of him and one hand feeling the wall, and his heart all of a patter and a pitter."

PRO's Report

This, like every other year that Cumann na mBunscol Náisiúnta takes on, has been another successful one. The promotion of Gaelic Games in our Primary schools is paramount in this sporting climate, as we take on the challenge from other sports, to make our games the number 1 choice. As PRO for the National Committee I must emphasise the importance of communicating to everyone in your county, the activities Cumann na mBunscol offers the children of Ireland and the important role we play in every parish and community in Ireland.

Allianz Sponsorship

Allianz have agreed to continue their sponsorship of Cumann na mBunscol and we thank them very much for their support. They do ask us in return for the funding that we promote Allianz in all reports through the media. When the committee sat down with Allianz to look at the results, they were very impressed by the jump in the "Degree of Ownership" in some counties, in particular those who had a below percentage in 2011/12. This shows that counties have taken on board what was being asked of them. However we have counties who are still taking the National average down below 50%. The results from Kantar read as follows for the past 2 years

Overall Degree of Ownership (Allianz Mentions) Sept 2011 to June 2012 - 49%

Overall Degree of Ownership (Allianz Mentions) Sept 2012 to June 2013 - 45%

Overall Degree of Ownership (Allianz Mentions) Sept 2012 to Dec 2012 - 53%

As you can see we are still a long way from reaching that magical figure of 70%. I know counties will say that Kantar's results are not accurate but very few counties have come forward to question their results and there is definitely not a discrepancy of 20%. This year Kantar have allowed us to view their website and we, the committee, receive daily emails as newspaper reports are scanned for ownership. Having looked through the reports there is still a large amount of reports that do not contain the word "ALLIANZ".

Counties must ask themselves the following questions:

- If a paper refuses to print "Allianz" should they continue to use it?
- Have counties informed their schools to use "Allianz" in their reports?
- Should counties who have a high return of ownership be rewarded?
- Should counties who have a low return of ownership be sanctioned?

These are questions not only for the incoming committee to think about but you the delegates that are here representing your county.

INTO Congress

Our stand at the INTO congress in the Silver Springs Hotel, Cork was very popular with the delegates, with plenty of information and posters. I would like to thank Pat Culhane for co-ordinating the 3 days and to everyone who took time out to help at the stand.

InTouch

The page in the InTouch monthly magazine has been used throughout the year and I must thank Lori Kealy and Tom O'Sullivan for their work behind the scenes and keeping me in line with deadlines and the structure of the page. I would urge delegates here today to please forward any new initiatives that you are undertaking as a county or even any school within your county that have achieved an accolade through GAA. It would be much easier to maintain this page if counties could use this page as a source of publicity. Carlow, Tyrone and Down all gave me articles which went to press throughout the year.

Each Sunday from the 11th August 240 pupils represented their schools and counties in exhibition games in Croke Park.

It was very heartening to note that more and more counties are using a selection procedure that is not based on competition.

Each county was allocated a minimum of 6 places with Cork receiving 12 and Dublin 24. Each of the Provinces received 5 places in a particular code and every county was represented on Hurling Final and Football Final Day. I would like to thank all our county secretaries for their tremendous co-operation in ensuring that our system works perfectly.

As well as the 240 children playing in the exhibition matches each year we have our Young Whistlers. - (D) The function of "Cumann na mBunscol" shall be:-

(9) To operate and maintain an insurance policy so that cover can be provided for officers and members of committees of "Cumann na mBunscol" while organising and promoting the games/activities.

- (E) The philosophy of "Cumann na mBunscol" shall be:-To promote Gaelic Games in an atmosphere of fun and enjoyment and to make Gaelic Games the games of choice in our primary schools.
- (F) Constitution: "Cumann na mBunscol" shall be constituted as follows:

N.B. Every third year the Annual General Meeting will consider a review presented to it by a sub-committee of Cumann na mBunscol on the organisation of the 'Mini-Sevens'. Proposed changes will be voted in and if **3.** The National Committee shall carry out the successful, will come into effect for the following years 'Mini-Sevens'.

*Special General Meeting:

- 1. A special General Meeting may be called by An Coiste Náisiúnta or by the special written request of 12 or more County/Provincial Coisti stating the reason for such a meeting.
- **2.** (a) On the receipt of 12 or more written requests for a Special General Meeting, the National Secretary must inform the Chairman who will call a meeting within 14 days.

(b) An Coiste Náisiúnta must also give 14 davs written notice of the Special General Meeting

- 10. All routine correspondence with affiliated areas shall be done by the Secretary.
- **11.** All correspondence with the GAA, State Departments and Public Bodies shall be carried out by the Secretary in consultation with the other bodies.

12. (a) The National Treasurer shall be responsible for verification of all expenses

(b) The Treasurer, in conjunction with Accounts Department Croke Park shall be responsible for

- The maintenance of proper financial records. (i)
- (ii) An annual audit of the accounts.
- (iii) Presentation of accounts to the Annual General Meeting.

13. The PRO shall in consultation with the other officers:

(a) Take every available opportunity to publicise the work of Cumann na mBunscol and to ensure that Gaelic games are promoted as the games of choice in our primary schools.

(b) Ensure that the 'Aims and Objectives' of Cumann na mBunscol be protected and advanced in dealing with outside agencies.

(c) Prepare all National Press Releases on behalf of An Coiste Naisiunta. Cumann na mBunscol.

14. The Development Officer shall in consultation with the other officers:

(a) Endeavour to raise standards in all counties by holding seminars, coaching courses, issue publications and liase with relevant bodies in pursuit of this objective.

(b) Identify weaknesses and with the help of County Coisti, Provincial Councils and other relevant bodies seek to rectify them.

- 15. The delegate to Central Council will in consultation with the other officers promote the interests of Cumann na mBunscol at Central Council and endeavour to promote Primary School games at all times.
- 16. The remaining members of the National



Committee shall be the President, Assistant Secretary and if necessary Provincial delegates.

17. A Provincial Delegate will be a full member of the National Committee with full voting rights.

Provincial Councils

- 1. Provincial Councils shall be properly constituted under the aims and objectives of "Cumann na mBunscol".
- **2.** An Annual General Meeting of each Provincial Council will be held annually. This AGM is to be attended by the President of Cumann na mBunscol or his/her nominee from An Coiste Náisiúnta.
- **3.** The Provincial Secretary must inform the National Secretary of the venue and date of the Provincial AGM.

(a) Provincial Councils shall meet at least three times annually.

(b) The Provincial AGM is to be held before the National AGM.

- 4. Those entitled to vote at this meeting shall be the elected provincial officers and two delegates from each county.
- **5.** Those entitled to speak at this meeting shall be the elected officers and either of the two delegates from each county.
- **6.** Invited guests may speak at the invitation of the Provincial Council.
- 7. Delegates must attend a minimum of two out of three meetings.
- **8.** At this meeting the delegates will elect officers and a committee to run the affairs of the Provincial Council between Provincial Annual General Meetings.



- 9. The Minutes of the Provincial AGM must be sent to the National Secretary within a month of the Provincial AGM.
- **10.** The annual financial statement must be sent to the National Treasurer within a month of the Provincial AGM.
- **11.** Failure to send either the minutes or annual financial statement within a month of the Provincial AGM shall result in sanctions.
- 12. This committee shall promote the aims of Cumann na mBunscol and endeavour to raise the standards of Gaelic Games within the Province.
- 13. Each Provincial Council will liaise with An Coiste Naisiunta and the Provincial Councils of the GAA and other relevant bodies and endeavour to generate funds for the promotion and development of Cumann na mBunscol activities in that Province.
- 14. Two delegates from each Provincial Council will attend the Annual General Meeting and Special Meetings of Cumann na mBunscol.
- 15. An annual written report shall be presented to An Coiste Náisiúnta.
- 16. (a) The Provincial Treasurer shall be responsible for verification of all expenses (b) The Treasurer, shall be responsible for

(i) The maintenance of proper financial records. (ii) An annual audit of the accounts. (iii) Presentation of accounts to the Annual **General Meeting.**

- **17.** Each Provincial Committee will notify and invite a delegate from An Coiste Naisiunta to the Provincial AGM, in the absence of the National President.
- 18. Provincial status is to be granted to GB.

County Schools Committees:

- 1. Each County Schools Committee shall be properly constituted under the aims and objectives of Cumann na mBunscol.
- 2. A General Meeting of each County Schools Committee will be held annually. Each County Schools Committee must meet at least three times annually, including the AGM.
- 3. All Primary Schools in the County will be sent written notification of that meeting.
- 4. Elections will be held at this meeting and Officers and a Committee will be appointed to run the affairs of Cumann na mBunscol in that affiliated area between meetings.
- 5. This committee shall promote the aims and objectives of Cumann na mBunscol and endeavour to raise the standards of Gaelic Games in their County in line with National Policy.
- 6. This Committee shall adjudicate on all activities of Cumann na mBunscol within the County.
- 7. Decisions of Cumann na mBunscol may be appealed to 'An Coiste Gearán' within the County. The decision of An Coiste Gearán will be final.

(a) An Coiste Gearán should be elected at the AGM. Members of 'An Coiste Gearán' should not be officers or members of the Committee within the County.

8. (a) The County Treasurer shall be responsible for verification of all expenses (b) The Treasurer, shall be responsible for

(i) The maintenance of proper financial records. (ii) An annual audit of the accounts. (iii) Presentation of accounts to the Annual **General Meeting.**

- 9. A statement of Accounts must be forwarded to the 4. All nominations for positions on the National Committee which shall be in the name of an National Treasurer annually. affiliated area or Provincial Council and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach Annual General Meeting and Special Meetings of the National Secretary not later than three weeks before the AGM. - 11. Each county shall formally adopt a constitution, a copy of which shall be forwarded to An Coiste Náisiúnta for ratification.
- 12. Each County Coiste shall adopt a code of practice in line with any of the following: GAA Code of Practice in Youth Sport or DES / **DENI** quidelines on Child Protection.
- 13. When affiliating to Cumann na mBunscol annually, teachers and B.O.M./B.O.G. agree to be bound by the rules of Cumann na mBunscol.
- 14. County committees shall accept correspondence 8. All motions must be clear and unambiguous and only from the school through the Chairperson, the must not conflict with the aims and objectives of principal or the designated teacher. Cumann na mBunscol.

Standing Orders:

- 1. A Standing Orders sub-committee comprising of the Provincial Chairmen and Secretaries or their reps shall consider all motions and nominations and decide if they are in order and acceptable for presentation at the AGM.
- **2.** The Cathaoirleach shall preside over all meetings and shall see that the rules of the organisation be enforced sensibly and fairly on all occasions.
- 3. Motions to the Annual General Meeting, which shall be in the name of County Coistí, Provincial Council or An Coiste Náisiúnta and formally adopted at a meeting of that body, must reach the National Secretary not later than four weeks before the AGM.



- 5. Copies of the agenda for the AGM together with list of motions and nominations for elections to National Committee shall be circulated to all affiliated areas and Provincial Councils at least 7 days before the AGM.
- 6. Amendments and agenda will be with the National Secretary in writing in the name of an affiliated area or Provincial Council at least one hour before the AGM.
- 7. Contrary motions shall not be accepted.
- 9. (a) To be deemed in order a motion must be implementable and must be specific to Cumann na mBunscol.

(b) However motions may call on Cumann na mBunscol to negotiate with relevant bodies on a specific matter that is of interest to Cumann na mBunscol.

- **10.** The mover of a proposal shall speak for not more than two minutes.
- **11.** The seconder of a proposal shall speak for no more than two minutes.
- **12.** No motion shall be discussed for more than 20 minutes. The motion must be disposed of when the 20 minutes have elapsed. No speaker shall speak for more than two minutes.



- 13. Each delegate shall register and each speaker shall identify themselves, name and unit.
- **14.** The mover shall have the right of reply in all cases. 2 minutes maximum.
- **15.** Voting shall be by a show of hands on all motions. A simple majority shall ensure the adoption of any item. Where rule changes are proposed, a two thirds majority shall be necessary in every instance to ensure their adoption.
- **16.** The usual method for the disposal of amendments and agenda shall be followed.
- **17.** In the event of the proposition "That the question be put", and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall on a show of hands either continue the debate or 'Put the question'.
- **18.** In the event of the proposition "That the AGM, move to next business " and that this proposition be seconded, the presiding Cathaoirleach shall put the proposition to a vote immediately. If defeated the debate shall be resumed.
- **19.** If a position on the National Committee be contested, voting shall be by secret ballot. A successful candidate must have 50% + 1 of the valid votes cast by delegates present and voting at the AGM. In the event of a tie, the winning candidate will be drawn by lot.
- **20.** The Cathaoirleach may at his/her discretion ask if there is no obvious objection to a motion that the motion be put in order, to save time.
- **21.** The Cathaoirleach may at his/her discretion and in consultation with order officers change the order of business in the interest of efficiency.
- **22.** The order of business may also be changed at the request of a majority of delegates present and voting.

- **23.** Only properly constituted delegates may speak at the AGM.
- **24.** Other speakers may only address the AGM when prior arrangements are made through the National Committee.

* Grievances and Complaints in all matters:

- 1. Grievances and complaints in regard of matters within an area will be settled within that area.
- 2. Each County will have a constitutionally elected Coiste Gearán to deal with appeals arising from decisions of the County Coiste.
- **3.** Complaints, Objections and Counter Objections: Any complaints or objections must be lodged with the Runaí Chontae in writing within 3 days of the game. The Runaí informs the other party who also has 3 days to respond in writing.

The matter can then be dealt with by the Coiste Chontae. The decision will then be conveyed to both parties. Any party dissatisfied with the decision of the Coiste may appeal in writing to the Runaí Chontae Cumann na mBunscol within 3 days. This appeal will be heard by the Coiste Gearán.

4. Coiste Gearán: This is an appeals body.

> A minimum of 5 are elected to this committee at the A.G.M. No member of the Officer Board of Coiste Chontae, Cumann na mBunscol or anybody who has heard the original objection may sit on An Coiste Gearán. No member of the Coiste Gearán may consider any appeal involving their own school. The Coiste Gearán may call all interested parties. A quorum of 3 is necessary to hear all appeals. The decision of the Coiste Gearán is final and binding.

- (a) Grievances, complaints and objections dealing with issues outside County Jurisdiction will be dealt with by the **National Committee and that decision will be final.**
- 5. Sanctions will be taken against any Coiste, National, Provincial or County or any member for the following reasons:
 - bringing the organisation into disrepute, or
 - failure to implement National Policy.

*Sanctions:

- 1. Misuse of organisational funds. Automatic Disassociation.
- 2. Conduct unbecoming a member of 'Cumann na mBunscol'. Automatic Disassociation.





- 3. Failure of a County to furnish a statement of accounts. Withholding of grants and tickets.
- 4. Failure of a County to furnish a secretary's report. Withholding of grants and tickets.
- Failure to hold an A.G.M. plus relevant meetings and two additional meetings. Withholding of all monies and tickets due to that County / Provincial Coiste.
- 6. Failure of County / **Provincial units** to honour obligations to sponsorship agreements. Witholding of sponsorship monies.
- **7**. Failure to comply with/implement the Constitution. Witholding of grants and other benefits.
- **8.** Failure to comply with/implement National Policy. Witholding of grants and other benefits.
