

St Brigid's Boys' NS, Foxrock produced a strong second half display underneath the Cusack Stand at Croke Park on Monday, October 23 to claim the Corn An Gearaltach at the expense of Scoil Thomáis Laurel Lodge.

Sam Kennedy helped himself to a brace of second half goals and with Josh Murphy and Harry Whelan also shaking the net, they had nine points to spare in the end. It had been a dream start to the action for Brigid's as a 1-1 haul from Murphy was supplemented by white flag efforts from Kennedy (two) and Harry Dunne.

This had the Foxrock outfit seven points in front with just nine minutes gone on the clock, but Thomáis subsequently came storming into the game courtesy of unanswered scores from Daire Nulty (two), Lachlan Finlay and Joe Manicle. While Brigid's settled again with Kennedy's third point of the contest, back-to-back contributions from Manicle brought the Thomáis deficit down to two (1-5 to 0-6) in time for the interval.

Manicle's pointed free left the bare minimum between the teams on the resumption, before Brigid's once again reasserted their authority. In the space of 60 seconds, Kennedy and Whelan raised green flags to leave them firmly in the driving seat.

Another sweet three-pointer followed from Kennedy on 34 minutes, in advance of Leon Barrett and Mark O'Leary (two) splitting the uprights. This placed the outcome beyond doubt, but Thomáis did end the proceedings with their heads held high after Braidan Smyth fired to the net off a precise Nulty pass.

St. Helen's SNS produced a late flourish at GAA HQ on Monday, October 23 to edge an extraordinary 11-goal thriller against Sacred Heart NS, Ballygall in the Corn Micheál O Muircheartaigh decider.

The tempo for this game was established right from the word go with three goals being scored in as many minutes during the early exchanges. While Sacred Heart (who were comentored on the day by Na Fianna footballer Conor Baxter) broke the deadlock through a Nathan Tiernan three-pointer, Helen's came to life with quickfire goals of their own from Devin Madden and Cian Fagan.

The Portmarnock outfit took control from here for a period of time with Darragh Healy and Leo Byrne points arriving either side of a 1-1 salvo by Sam Flynn. The impressive Zac Dunne did get Sacred Heart back into contention with an excellent goal, before Madden's second cancelled out his effort at the opposite end. Despite Billy O'Donovan adding two points for the Ballygall boys, key contributions from the midfield pairing of Healy (two) and Harry Johnston gave Helen's a 4-6 to 2-2 interval buffer.

Yet Sacred Heart's attacking prowess meant there was always a chance that the pendulum could swing in this game and so it proved. Squeezed in between points by Sean White, Dunne bagged his second goal of the play on 27 minutes. Although a Healy free looked set to help Helen's settle, Dunne completed a hat-trick of goals on the half-hour mark to leave the tie delicately poised. While Daniel Walsh kicked two fine points for Helen's, 1-3 without reply – including an O'Donovan goal – suddenly had Sacred Heart in the ascendancy on a score of 5-8 to 4-9. However, Helen's didn't panic and further goals from Fagan and Healy saw them snatching victory from the jaws of defeat.


